





Italy



- Mussolini wanted to recapture the glory of ancient Rome, especially after the First World War
- Fasci di Combattimento: groups"
- Italian government turned eye to fascist violence an Mussolini power in 1922

Nazi Germany



- Would likely not have come to power without the Great Depression
 Blamed Jews for all of Germany's problems
 - -"Capitalist Jews"-"Communist Jews"

Came to power using violence and intimidation tactics

German government turned a blind eye to Nazi violence

• Even tried taking over the government by force in 1923

In the early 1930s, support for the Nazis steadily increased

- 1928: 3%1930: 18%
- 1932: 37%
- 1933: 44%
