
By late 1943, most of the German high command could see that the writing was on the wall, and that Germany would eventually lose the



Together, these men plunged Germany into the abyss...






After victory at Stalingrad, the Soviet Red Army never looked back, fighting a brutal campaign to beat German forces all the way back to Berlin








This was the final major battle in Europe. It was fought between Germany and the Soviet

Union



Pictures like this show how desperate the situation was for Germany









Hitler still refuses to give up, and would rather send every last German man, woman, and child to their death than surrender.

Soviet losses are high *80,000 killed

- 280,000 sick or wounded



But German losses are even higher...

- As much as 500,000 soldiers killed and another 500,000 captured
- 125,000 civilians killed



With Soviet forces only a few hundred metres away, Hitler commits suicide on 30 April 1945



Germany surrenders on 7 May 1945



In the Pacific, the war drags on until August 1945. But more on that later...





Food for thought....

German casualties on the Eastern Front:

- 3 million killed
- 3 million POW. 1 million of these never make it back to Germany



German casualties at the Battle of Berlin

• Up to 500,000 killed











German casualties on the Western Front:

- 340,000 killed
- 7.6 million POW. Of these around 50,000 never make it back to Germany

Allied Casualties

- Soviet Union: 10 million soldiers and around
 20 million civilians killed
- Britain and United States: both over
 300,000 killed
- · Canada: 35,000 killed
